Goldie arrived 3/1/2013 as a stray pregnant mama. In a few days she had a beautiful litter of 5 healthy kitties. When they became of age and were fully socialized, her kittens quickly found homes. Unfortunately Goldie is still looking for one of her own.



Otto arrived 3/19/2014 as a stray. We don't know much else about him, other than he is declawed (so he WILL need to be an indoor only cat) and he is very sweet... when you can catch him! He can be very skittish and flighty.

The two of them became free-roamers (outside of a kennel) at the shelter around the same time and they quickly paired up as the “shy guys,” despite not knowing each other previously. They could often be found hanging out on top of the tall metal kennel in the main cat room, away from the commotion.

If they happened to come down onto the floor when no one was around, they would quickly dart to their hiding spot if a person appeared.

Both Otto and Goldie are truly very sweet cats and loving of human attention. They're just a quite reserved and shy in the stressful environment of the Shelter. They would surely flourish in a quiet, loving home

Otto and Goldie don't necessarily *have* to go to the same home, but because they have become such great friends, it would make both of them happier. A quieter home away from the hustle and bustle is needed. They would be fine with mature, gentle children; other calm cats; or a calm dog. Otto and Goldie are both 3 ½ years old.

After 2 years of rehabilitation at the Kodiak Animal Shelter, Baxter is finally ready for the world!

He has come a tremendous way since arriving at the Shelter, needing to be lured and bribed out of his kennel with tuna. He was leery of new people (especially men), but after lots of socialization, love, and security, now he has no issues accepting you into his pack.



Baxter is a beautiful 3 and a half year old German Shepherd. He requires an experienced, proactive dog owner. He is fine with some dogs (depending on personality) and an aloof cat, but he cannot go to a home with children younger than 15. Baxter is a very intelligent boy who requires regular mental and physical stimulation. He knows how to sit, shake, and lay down, and he is also housebroken.



He is available for viewing by appointment only and you must have an approved application on file first. Any animals in the household must be spayed/neutered and current on vaccines, and the yard must be fenced.
